# <u>Voting Corner</u>

- If you previously applied for a mail-in ballot, you can check the status <u>here</u>. The City of Philadelphia began sending ballots to applicants this week.
- If you have not already applied to vote by mail (or if you have not registered to vote), remember that you can register, apply for a mail-in ballot, and submit your ballot in one stop at one of the city's satellite locations. You can also use these sites to drop off a completed ballot if you already received yours in the mail or to request a replacement ballot if yours never arrived. <u>Here</u> is a list of currently open locations, as well as those that will open in the coming weeks. Find a location near you and make a plan!
- When filling out your ballot, make sure you follow all directions to submit your ballot. Your ballot will come with two envelopes, a secrecy envelope and an outer envelope. You need to use both to ensure your vote will be counted. Completed ballots need to be placed inside the secrecy envelope first and then the secrecy envelope inside the outer envelope, which needs to be signed and dated. This <u>video on mail-in ballots</u> from the PA Department of State is a useful resource and outlines all the steps you need to take to for your vote to count.
- While the uncertainty of COVID-19 and the possibility of rising cases in colder weather is certainly a reason to consider taking advantage of early voting at the city's satellite offices, you can find a current list of proposed locations for in-person voting on Election Day <u>here</u>. Your polling place may be different from where you have voted in previous years, so be sure to check!
- If you already have a plan to vote, don't forget to make sure your friends and family do, too! If you are looking to volunteer, there are lots of great organizations to look into, including <u>When We All Vote</u>.

# OPEN ENROLLMENT @ WCS for 2021-2022 School Year

Starting on September 25, 2020, anyone interested in applying to our school for the 2021-22 school year can easily apply by going to <u>applyphillycharter.org</u> on their phone, tablet or computer, and following these simple steps:

- If you don't already have an account on <u>applyphillycharter.org</u>, create an account using your email address
- · Fill out your family profile
- Click Apply for September 2021
- Select the box next to Wissahickon Charter School
- Submit the application

*If you already have a child in our school and are interested in applying for a sibling, you will need to apply using Apply Philly Charter.* At the end of the application, you will be asked if your child has a sibling already attending Wissahickon Charter School. Just provide the current student's name and birthdate. **The application window closes on January 25, 2022.**

## \*Student Materials in Fox Backpacks\*

We are starting to use the materials in student bags regularly. Please make sure wherever your student is working for the day (daycare, grandmas.etc), they have their backpacks with all their materials with them. Without them, it's hard to fully participate in what the class is doing, whether they're reading a novel from the bag, putting their answers on the whiteboard, or using a Math tool. Helpful tip: old socks make great erasers for the boards! Thanks!

## **Reading Small Groups**

All grades have now started their small group Reading time. Some students have 1-2 small group sessions a day and some students have a few each week. These sessions are **really** where students will <u>learn to read</u>. Some students have been confused about the schedule or haven't been attending these afternoon sessions. Please make sure your children know when they should come to small groups. K-3 families can check the students SeeSaw for information. 4th grade small group times are on Google Classroom. This is one of their MOST important times of day.

## <u>Headphones</u>

Headphones are a great way to make sure that your children can hear class clearly and that when they come off mute to answer a question that we can really hear them. Any headset with a mic works well. <u>Here</u> is a great one for \$15 on Amazon.

## 8th Grade Families

Attention 8th Grade Families from Your School Counselors:

High school applications will open on September 18, 2020 - November 6, 2020. The High School Advising meetings are beginning October 12th -**30th.** You should have received a message in ClassTag with the conference schedule. Please sign up for a time that works for you. Students and parents are expected to attend the meeting together. We will not be able to complete any applications without the parent(s). Please do not complete this application alone. We will meet via Zoom and do it together. We do this to make sure that all of the required information and extra documents are ready and in the right place before submitting. Parents, please make sure that you and your child have at least 5 district schools picked prior to your scheduled conference in order to complete the application. This does not include Charter Schools or Private Schools. Please see THIS document for some examples of the types of High Schools or visit www.greatphillyschools.org to research different high schools in Philadelphia. This list (first 2 tabs) gives a quick view of all citywide and special admission schools in the District.
