Restorative Justice at Home Tip of the Week:

Developing a peace corner in your home. Peace corners can be used to help children self-regulate, but should not be confused with a time-out corner. They can be used to relax while processing feelings and emotions. Peace corners

can be used for moments of deep breathing, reading, coloring,or journaling about one's feelings and emotions. One peace corner can be used for everyone in the household or each person can create their own individual peace corner.
