iPads & Zoom

K-2 Families, Please note that Zoom requires a lot of power when in use on our iPads. These power requirements are multiplied when Zoom is used in conjunction with other applications. Our recommendation is to make sure the iPad is charging every night (5-7 hours to fully charge) so that it's at 100% and ready to go in the mornings. During school hours, we also recommend plugging the iPad in before it gets to 50% battery level to avoid the battery level getting too low.
