Message from Dean Kristi:

Dear Families,

I am writing to share an important update for Kindergarten families. In addition to the Remote Access Center program we shared about a couple of weeks ago, Wissahickon will also be inviting all of our Kindergarten students to join a hybrid program beginning on April 26. We are still working on many of the details of this program but it will likely be a true hybrid program where students come into school two days a week to learn and spend three days learning remotely. Note: Kindergarten families can choose to stay totally remote if they prefer to. Next week, there will be more communication to all Kindergarten families with many more details. In the meantime, if your Kindergarten student was invited to be part of the Remote Access Center program, know that you will need to choose one or the other program. Your child cannot enroll in both. You do not have to make a choice until you know more about the Kindergarten program.

While we're busy at work with planning around bringing these select groups into the building, we are also working to build in safeguards so that the remote program continues to be strong.







New Music Program Pilot for T3!!

Awbury Middle School has partnered with Rock to the Future to offer a new music program at WCS!! We will be beginning this program with 6th grade, starting in T3, as a graded course. Students had the choice of choosing between the Digital Music or Vocal Ensemble (chorus); a track that they will potentially stay on in both 7th and then 8th grade.

Please see the description of each of the classes below.

In Rock to the Future's Vocal Ensemble, students will sing popular songs and learn vocal warm-ups, pitch, tone, and vocal technique, build music foundations, and gain exposure to a wide variety of vocal styles. Students will record a group song for the culminating showcase.

In Rock to the Future's Digital Music, students will learn to create beats, remix popular songs, write their own tracks, learn about different instruments, and build music foundations. A culminating showcase will include student created music.
