Message from the Principals:

Dear Families,

As Dean Kristi wrote, WCS is heart broken and horrified by the recent violence in Atlanta and stands with the Asian American community. Our Race and Equity Committee has developed Morning Meeting activities for students to engage in next week to bring greater awareness about Asian American cultures and increase understanding and empathy. With our race and equity work, it must be clear we stand against <u>all</u> intolerance and hate.

We will also be working on training with staff around increasing understanding of Asian American communities and how to bring more awareness into the classroom. We want to ensure that *all* of our students' identities are acknowledged and celebrated, including every student who identifies as Asian-American, Latino, white, Native American, mixed heritage or international heritage, in order to promote empathy among us all. **It is important that we provide texts and topics that provide both "mirrors" (learning**

about people similar to us) and "windows" (learning about people different from us) for all students.




Give Kids A Smile Week 2021
