# Message from the Dean Kristi:

Dear Families,

As we head into spring break, I can't help but feel hopeful about what lies ahead. I know that this past year has been challenging in so many ways. I also know that this hardship isn't completely behind us. Still, with more and more people being vaccinated in the city and with the CDC's new guidelines that students can social distance safely at three feet (rather than the six feet that was previously recommended), it feels like there is a light at the tunnel.

#### Spring Plans and Looking to the Fall

For Wissahickon, as you know, we will launch our Remote Access Centers and our in person Kindergarten programs in April. The number of students coming in represents 25% of our total student body, which is a higher percentage than most schools in Philadelphia.

If we had more time in the year remaining, we would bring back additional grades or groups. Because of the timing, we do not have any plans to bring back additional students this year. Nonetheless, this work with this 25% is vitally important to every student and family as we plan for fall. This is the time to practice and refine all of the protocols that may still be needed when 100% of us are back together, as I have confidence we will be in September.

#### **New Programs and Positions**

As we work on planning our in person programs for this spring, we are also looking ahead to determine what will serve all students best when they return in the fall. Over the next two years, Wissahickon will receive federal funding to provide much needed support and programs. We are thinking about the emotional and academic toll that this time has taken on our children and the potential programs or positions needed to address it. We will want to hear from WCS families and students around this planning.

#### **Consistency in Leadership**

Finally, I want to share that every member of our Cross Site Leadership Team is returning next year. We have 14 people on this team with a combined 136 years of experience at our schools-- not in education-- <u>at our schools</u>. This kind of consistency in schools is incredibly rare. We stay because we get to partner with incredible colleagues and families doing work that really matters, serving children who we truly love, centering the values that we all believe in. The fact of this gives me real peace as we look ahead, even while things are still difficult.

# Restorative Justice at Home Tip of the Week: Ask the Right Questions

After a conflict or disagreement, when both parent and child [or child and child!] are ready to talk, each person should have the chance to say their piece. Mody suggests the following five questions as a good starting point for the restorative process:

- What happened?
- What were you thinking/feeling at the time?
- What have you thought about since it happened?
- Who has been affected?
- What do you think needs to be done to make it right?

You may not need to use every question for every disagreement. The important point is to get to how each person experienced the disagreement or conflict, what each person felt,
