Message from Dean Kristi

Dear Families,

I shared earlier this week that our Fernhill campus has moved to remote learning for the next two weeks due to Covid-19 cases. The situation evolved quickly there and I learned a few things about how to prepare that I want to share in case we find ourselves in this same situation at Awbury at some point. Awbury does not currently have any cases so this is just to make sure that we are prepared for the future.

First off, our practice is to post our number of cases at each campus weekly on our website. You can always check Family Resources (<u>link here</u>) to see the current number of cases we've had. Any families or classes who are directly impacted by a positive case of Covid-19 receive calls and messages with news and updates but we have not sent messages about each case to the whole school. If we have a spike in cases that is higher

than normal but still lower than the threshold to close the school, I will make sure I send a message to the whole school community to keep you informed.

Secondly, I want to ask you again to please purchase chargers to keep at home. If we need to go remote at some point, the school cannot send chargers home with every child. If you have a student in K-2, they will need an iPad charger (same as an iPhone charger). Students in 3rd-8th will need a Chromebook charger. I'm resharing information about where to find them. Having this at home means you are ready!

Front Office Updates

- **Phones** Please note that our front office staff assists with arrival and dismissal. If you call the office before 9:30 AM or after 2:30 PM, there is no guarantee staff will be able to answer your call. If your call is not answered, please leave a message.
- Arrival We are asking any parents who walk their child up to not park on the school side of Washington Lane, so there can be a constantly flowing line of traffic coming into the driveway from the parking lane. This will increase safety and speed of drop off. Thanks!
- Masks We are spending thousands of dollars on student masks. Please make sure your child has one on when they get to school and has a spare in their backpack. If parents are able, please send in boxes of masks to support us! The disposable adult and child masks are perfect.

Water Bottles Needed Daily

One of our COVID safety mitigation features includes having covers on our water fountains to prevent use. In place of the traditional water fountains, we put in water bottle dispensers and gave each student a water bottle with their name on it that they need to travel between school and home with. Some students are starting to come to school without water bottles and this is causing a lot of different problems for us. It is imperative that each student comes to school with either the water bottle that we gave them or one from home.

Flat Rate Program Payment
