Health Update

In the last few weeks, the number of flu cases has been on the rise. According to the Pennsylvania Department of Health, as of January 20, the flu is considered to be widespread in Pennsylvania. Here at WCS, we now have several confirmed cases. We also have seen a number of instances of upper respiratory and stomach viruses.

As a reminder, if your child has a fever over 100, please keep them home until 24 hours after the fever has resolved. If your child has diarrhea or vomiting, please also keep them home for 24 hours after their last bout. Students can return to school once 24 hours have passed, they are eating and drinking normally, and their energy level has returned to normal.

Please contact the nurses' office if your child is diagnosed with any infectious illness, as the nurses keep track of illness trends at school.

Following these guidelines should allow your children to heal more rapidly and should also allow our school community to remain as healthy as possible!

The nurse will be conducting annual screenings for weight, height and vision for all grades. If you have any questions please contact the nurse.

"The PSSAS begin the week of April 9th for students in grades 3-8. The testing windows are as follows:

- April 9-13: English Language Arts
- · April 16-20: Mathematics
- April 23-27: Science (Grades 4-8 only)
- May 8-12: Makeups as needed

We are excited to report that the Pennsylvania Department of Education has made a significant reduction to testing time, with the English Language Arts and Mathematics tests each having one fewer day of testing.

Some parents have expressed interest in having their children "opt out" of the PSSAs due to religious beliefs. While a family can opt a child out at any point, we are requesting this year that you provide us with notice by the end of February so that we can make adequate preparations for how they will spend testing time.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students are permitted to use their cell phones during instructional time ONLY if permission is given by a teacher and is closely monitored by the teacher for the purposes of:

- Listening to music while wearing ear buds so long as the music is appropriate for school and is not heard through the
 ear buds.
- · Using the calculator function on their phone
- · Researching a problem, question or define a word via the web
- Taking pictures ONLY if permission is given by the teacher, i.e. project presentations and/or yearbook
- Students ARE permitted to have their phones present during recess so long as they are using them responsibly and they are not negatively impacting anyone.
- Students are permitted to use their phones in the cafe to listen to music if they so choose to do so, however, earbuds must be worn.
- Once students enter the building, after 8:30a.m. all cell phones and ear buds must be put completely away.
- If an an adult sees a student with a phone in their hand between 8:30a.m. and 3:15p.m. with the exception of the
 parameters outlined, the adult WILL immediately confiscate the phone and give it to the Dean of Culture. The student
 will be able to pick up their phone at the end of the day

Important Shift in Volunteer/Parent Clearance Requirements

The Pennsylvania Department of Education's provided additional clarification about volunteer clearances. Parents who volunteer occasionally to chaperone a field trip are <u>not</u> required to have clearances

as long as they will not be solely responsible for a child/group of children's well-being. Parents/guardians who chaperone trips on a regular basis throughout the year and any parent/volunteer for outdoor trips must still have their clearances. In addition, any person (parent or otherwise) who volunteer at the school on a regular basis must still have their clearances.

We are pleased to inform you that Wissahickon Charter School has implemented a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2017-2018 school year.

What does this mean for you and your children attending the school identified above?

Great news for you and your students! All enrolled students of Wissahickon Charter School (Fernhill and Awbury) are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at no charge to your household each day of the 2017-2018 school year starting November 1st 2017.
