Voting Corner

- If you previously applied for a mail-in ballot, you can check the status [here](#). The City of Philadelphia began sending ballots to applicants this week.
- If you have not already applied to vote by mail (or if you have not registered to vote), remember that you can register, apply for a mail-in ballot, and submit your ballot in one stop at one of the city's satellite locations. You can also use these sites to drop off a completed ballot if you already received yours in the mail or to request a replacement ballot if yours never arrived. [Here](#) is a list of currently open locations, as well as those that will open in the coming weeks. Find a location near you and make a plan!
- When filling out your ballot, make sure you follow all directions to submit your ballot. Your ballot will come with two envelopes, a secrecy envelope and an outer envelope. You need to use both to ensure your vote will be counted. Completed ballots need to be placed inside the secrecy envelope first and then the secrecy envelope inside the outer envelope, which needs to be signed and dated. This [video on mail-in ballots](#) from the PA Department of State is a useful resource and outlines all the steps you need to take to for your vote to count.
- While the uncertainty of COVID-19 and the possibility of rising cases in colder weather is certainly a reason to consider taking advantage of early voting at the city's satellite offices, you can find a current list of proposed locations for in-person voting on Election Day [here](#). Your polling place may be different from where you have voted in previous years, so be sure to check!
- If you already have a plan to vote, don't forget to make sure your friends and family do, too! If you are looking to volunteer, there are lots of great organizations to look into, including [When We All Vote](#).

- Submit the application

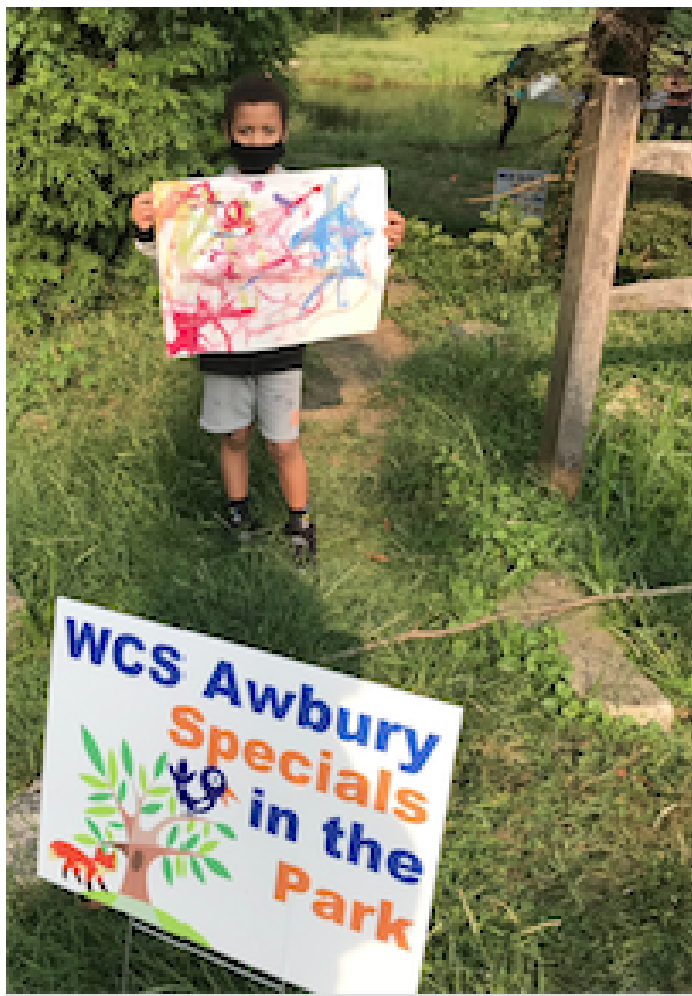

Student Materials in Fox Backpacks

We are starting to use the materials in student bags regularly. Please make sure wherever your student is working for the day (daycare, grandmas.etc), they have their backpacks with all their materials with them. Without them, it's hard to fully participate in what the class is doing, whether they're reading a novel from the bag, putting their answers on the whiteboard, or using a Math tool. Helpful tip: old socks make great erasers for the boards! Thanks!

Reading Small Groups

All grades have now started their small group Reading time. Some students have 1-2 small group sessions a day and some students have a few each week. These sessions are really where students will learn to read. Some students have been confused about the schedule or haven't been attending these afternoon sessions. Please make sure your children know when they should come to small groups. K-3 families can check the students SeeSaw for information. 4th grade small group times are on Google Classroom. This is one of their MOST important times of day.

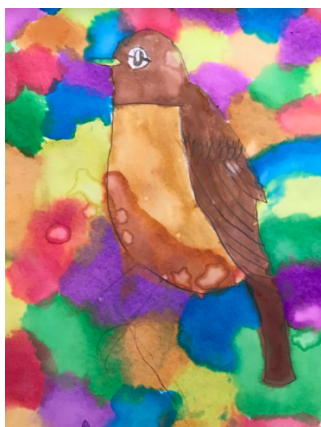
The National Junior Honor Society (NJHS)

Dear Families,

Due to recent changes in Pennsylvania election law, early mail-in ballot voting begins this year on September 29th and will continue until Election Day on November 3rd. No matter what your political beliefs are, it is important to vote to make sure your vote is counted.

If you are not registered, go to [this website](#) to register. Don't wait, register now. If you have any questions, you can call 1.877.VOTESPA (1.877.868.3772).

Due to the uncertainty around COVID-19, many people plan to vote using mail-in ballots. This option is new in Pennsylvania, but is a secure method that has been used successfully in other states. Mail-in ballots can be submitted by mail, at a mail-in ballot dropbox (locations in Philly TBD), or at an early voting location. You can track your mail-in ballot [here](#) to make sure it has been received.

Philadelphia will open seventeen early voting locations around the city on a rolling basis. Voters can request, receive, fill out, and submit a mail-in ballot in one stop. You can

also visit the offices to register to vote, request a mail-in ballot to take home and submit later, or to drop off a completed mail-in ballot. [This article provides more information about the locations opening next week.](#) We will send updates on new locations as they open in the coming weeks.

If you have already applied for a mail-in ballot, make sure you follow all directions to submit your ballot. Your ballot will come with two envelopes, a secrecy envelope and an outer envelope. You need to use both to ensure your vote will be counted. Completed ballots need to be placed inside the secrecy envelope first and then the secrecy envelope inside the outer envelope, which needs to be signed and dated. This [video on mail-in ballots](#) from the PA Department of State is a useful resource and outlines all the steps you need to take to for your vote to count.

If you choose to vote in person, remember to check your polling place location. Updated locations have not been announced yet, but many Philadelphia polling places will change this year.

Finally, as you think about the election, make a plan for how you will vote and then encourage at least three people in your life to also make a plan. It's too important to miss this election.

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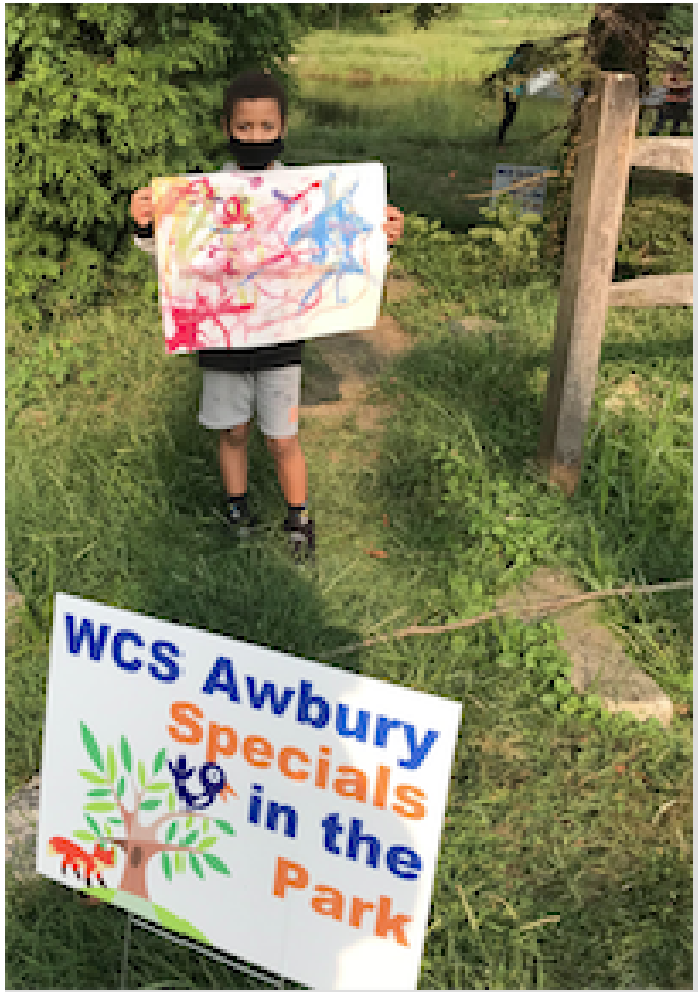

Dear Families,

I hope you are well and settling into new routines. On our end, we are learning every day how to use our tools more effectively. This takes time and humor and a lot of patience. Thank you for working with us.

The biggest challenge continues to be with technology. We are still expecting our large shipment of iPads and Chromebooks in the coming weeks and we're eager to get them out in your hands. In the meantime, I'm so glad that you have been reaching out to our helpdesk with all technology questions. You can do that by emailing helpis@wissahickoncharter.org. I ask for your patience as you submit items for help. Please know that our IT professionals are addressing all items in the order that they come in and each one takes time.

I also want to share that we are planning a Back to School Night but just like everything this year, it won't be the typical format. This will be structured more as an online evening for you to get support in any areas that are proving difficult. Stay tuned for more information!

Finally, last week we shared Zoom norms for students. Today, I'm sharing Zoom Norms for you as families and caregivers. Please see below for these.

Zoom Norms for Grown-ups

While teachers are online with students, we ask that you treat that time the same way you would as if they were teaching in the classroom. Please address any concerns or questions to teachers as follows:

- Send the teacher a message on ClassTag to set up a time to talk when it's convenient. This would apply to anything you'd like to discuss with them, like calling on students equitably or questions about the curriculum.
- For in the moment tech help, please reach out to Ms. Kate, Lower School Principal (oshea@wissahickoncharter.org) or Ms. Polite, Middle School Principal (lpolite@wissahickoncharter.org) so that the rest of the class isn't interrupted.
- Tech support hours are also available daily from 3-4 with Mr. Ish and Mr. Mike: <https://zoom.us/j/273141506?pwd=Q010SUdlVDF0eXJOcnE0RDdreGtHdz09> (password: tech)

Also, please be mindful of background noise because students are often muting and unmuting to participate. It's very helpful for all students to wear headphones and/or be in a quiet spot in the house.

Meals

WCS will be providing Breakfast and Lunch for Curbside Pickup at our schools while we are in our fully remote learning phase. These meals will be available to all WCS students. Meal Pickup days are Mondays and Thursdays, 11AM-2PM. For families who are not able to pick up meals on our days and times, please know you can pick up meals at a School District of Philadelphia site closer to your home on Fridays 9AM-2PM. Directions for picking up meals:

1. Upon arrival at the school, the family will call the Food Service Coordinator (FSC), and provide the first and last name of all students who will receive meals on that day.
 - Awbury families will call 215-983-0604
2. A staff member will then go to the cafeteria, retrieve the set amount of pre-bagged breakfasts & lunches while the parent pulls up to the Gym doors at Awbury. The bags will be loaded into the car by the staff member. The parent will exit through the rear parking lot of the school. There will be signs present to help guide the parent through.
3. Students/Guardians/Parents may not exit their vehicles. This will deter the natural inclination for students who may wish to interact with any staff persons.

8th Grade Families

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Family Update on Specials

Our outdoor program Specials in the Park officially kicked off this week! That means online specials will look a little different going forward.

Students are expected to attend the full 45 minute synchronous online specials on Monday and Tuesday. If you attend an in person Specials in the Park you are given attendance credit for Specials that day. You will also not be penalized for missing class sessions during that block. This is when content-area teaching occurs, as well as when work is assigned for the week for grades 4 and up.

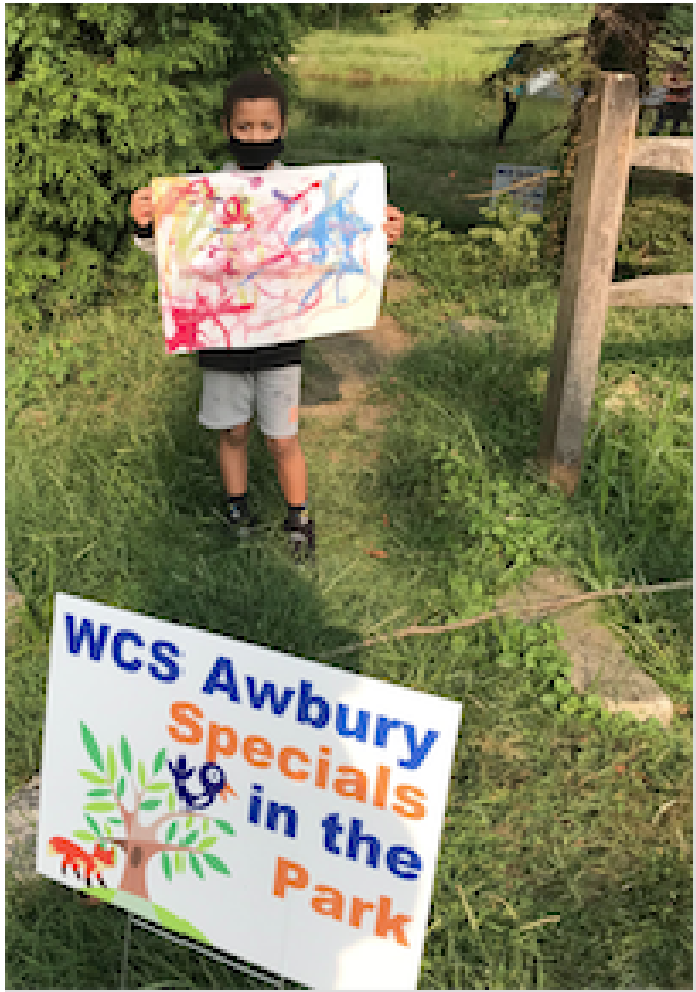

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Dear Families,

What a week! Thank you to everyone who came out for Materials Pick Up and to all of the students. It was exciting to see you again and to see your enthusiasm for being back together. Thanks also to everyone for their patience as we deal with the inevitable technical glitches that come with a fully remote model.

Here's some important information for this week:

- If you did not go to school for the Materials Pick Up, make a plan now to drop by next week on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday between 9:00am-3:00pm. The front office can hand out the materials that were given out this week.

- We are hopeful that we will have all new technology for everyone in about a month but this situation is very much outside of our control. **In the meantime, if you do NOT have any kind of device other than a phone on which to access our program, you must reach out to us immediately so we can troubleshoot with you. Please contact Ishmell Bradley at helpis@wissahickoncharter.org and cc: Ms. Kate at oshea@wissahickoncharter.org on this email as well so we are all in the loop.** Again, while a phone will allow your child to get on Zoom, it is not appropriate for the kinds of platforms we are using now.

School-Wide Norms Established by the Culture Think Tank

You need to be able to Listen, See & Speak

Zoom Norms

- Video on and eyes on screen (Permission to be off camera can be messaged privately or use of a virtual screen to allow privacy)
- Muted when not speaking
- Face is fully visible in the screen
- Focused conversation (to content) in the chat box, or chat box may get turned off
- Raise hand to be called on before unmuting
- Do not draw/annotate on the screen during academic time or share without permission
- Bathroom use: turn off camera and leave your laptop or tablet. Write a note in the chat to the teacher

Work Space

- Try to find a quiet space to be or use headphones
- Materials on hand
- Appropriate school dress
- Location that supports working/writing/typing (a table or desk where you can write/type easily is best; lying down in your bed is not appropriate)

Meals

WCS will be providing Breakfast and Lunch for Curbside Pickup at our schools while we are in our fully remote learning phase. These meals will be available to all WCS students. Meal Pickup days are Mondays and Thursdays, 11AM-2PM. For families who are not able to pick up meals on our days and times, please know you can pick up meals at a School District of Philadelphia site closer to your home on Fridays 9AM-2PM. Directions for picking up meals:

Meal Distribution Overview

WCS is pleased to announce that we will be providing Breakfast and Lunch for Curbside Pickup at our schools while we are in our fully remote learning phase. These meals will be available to all WCS students.

1. Director of School Operations and Food Service Vendor (Lintons) has designated (2) days for meal pickup.
 - Mondays and Thursdays

- Due to the holiday, the first meal distribution date is Thursday, September 10th
- 2. The timeframe will be 11AM-2PM.
- 3. Using safe distancing practices – Meals will be available for pick-up outside of the school building, using a curbside pick up process.
- Monday Pickups: Families will receive breakfast and lunch for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday
- Thursday Pickups: Families will receive breakfast and lunch for Friday and Monday

Directions for picking up meals:

1. Upon arrival at the school, the family will call the Food Service Coordinator (FSC), and provide the first and last name of all students who will receive meals on that day.
 - Awbury families will call 215-983-0604
 - Fernhill families will call 267-273-3304
2. A staff member will then go to the cafeteria, retrieve the set amount of pre-bagged breakfasts & lunches while the parent pulls up to the Gym doors at Awbury or the MS Commons doors at Fernhill. The bags will be loaded into the car by the staff member. The parent will exit through the rear parking lot of the school. There will be signs present to help guide the parent through.
3. Students/Guardians/Parents may not exit their vehicles. This will deter the natural inclination for students who may wish to interact with any staff persons.

Special Note: Families will be allowed to drop off used library books. The library books should be placed in a bag, and given to the staff member once the food has been placed in the car.

K-8 Outdoor Conferences and Orientation to Remote Learning

- They will take place from Tuesday, September 1st - Friday, September 4th. (Remember: The first day of remote school is Tuesday, September 8th.)

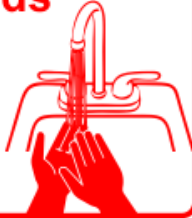

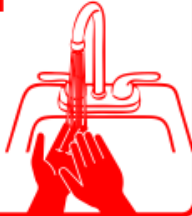

Message from Dean Kristi

Dear Families,

At this point in the summer, your children are hopefully well on their way through their summer work. If this is not the case, please don't delay in getting started now. This time right before school starts is important for getting students back into learning habits.

I have a couple of important announcements to share this week:

- We are delaying the start of school until Tuesday, September 8th to allow for safe, socially-distanced, outdoor, in person conferences on September

1st-3rd. After we share who your child's homeroom teacher is, we will send out the link to sign up for a conference slot.

- Work on our remote schedule continues and will be shared with you next week. We are sharing it with staff first so we can answer their questions before it goes out more broadly. In the meantime, the school day will be much more like a regular in-person school day. It will begin at 8:30 with Zoom meetings with homeroom teachers. The day will include a minimum of three hours of live learning on Zoom (synchronous) as well as work time off of Zoom as well (asynchronous).
- Right now, we are **tentatively** planning to invite kindergarten and first grade students into the building to start a hybrid (partly in person at school and partly remote) model of education on Thursday, December 3rd. These students would likely learn from home on Monday and attend in person from Tuesday-Friday. Our plan would then be to add additional grades gradually as we show that we are safely adhering to a successful health and safety plan in school. Actually starting the hybrid model on that date will be based on what is happening with the virus locally, on the guidance we receive from PDE and the CDC, and on our ability to properly staff the model.

Thank you for your patience and trust as we continue to make and share plans for the fall.

Staffing Shifts and Hiring Updates

We are excited to share some internal staffing shifts and new hire news with you all! Niema Golphin, who served as the Dean of Culture at the Fernhill Campus for the past 6 years, has moved into a newly created position on the Shared Services team. We are also pleased to share that we have two former WCS employees returning to the Awbury team next year! Jennifer Coppertino, who was a founding teacher at the Awbury campus and taught at WCS for 5 years, is returning as a 3rd grade teacher. Sarah Wilson,

who taught Middle School English at the Fernhill campus for 4 years and 5th Grade English at Awbury for 3 years, is also returning and will be the Middle School English Teacher.

Also new to the Middle School team are Andy Beck, who will be teaching 6th grade English and Social Studies, and Michele Engelbert, who will be teaching 6th grade Math & Science. Andy is a recent graduate of Penn GSE, where he was coached by Sarah Wilson, and Michele joins the team after 2 years of teaching middle school math in Washington, DC.

Lastly, Alyza Ngbokoli will join the team as a lead 2nd grade teacher. For this school year, Sherraine Senior will be shifting her focus and will be working to provide additional remote learning support and reading support to our youngest students from both campuses, which we know they will need and benefit from in this virtual model.

High School Application Updates

Message from Dean Kristi

Dear Families,

I want to thank you for all the ways you've been in touch over the past week since we shared that we plan to offer a remote model this fall. I want to especially thank all of the parents who came to our meeting on Wednesday night. It was incredibly helpful to hear your experiences and your questions.

We know that not everybody could be at the meeting so I wanted to share a few things that we know and that we're working on:

- Every student will be loaned a device from the school. Students in K-2nd grade will get an iPad and students in 3rd-8th grade will get a Chromebook.
- We will offer a food distribution program.
- We would like to get creative about some in-person socially distanced outdoor opportunities for connecting students, possibly using the parks across our city.
- We are working to launch the year by connecting teachers with their students through conferences.
- Feel free to only purchase the school supplies that were listed for use at home at this point and hold off on the supplies needed for when we return to our building.

We are working on a wealth of details right now and will stay in touch as we have them, including sharing much more information about how instruction will look.

Message from Dean Kristi

Dear Families,

I hope this finds you all well. I am writing to share the important news that Wissahickon will be in a fully remote model of instruction this fall. We will use the time we have remaining in the summer to plan for a stronger model than we were able to offer last spring.

While we believe in-person instruction is ultimately best for children, we cannot reopen our schools if it means compromising the safety of our community members. We also know that the hybrid model we have been developing was not actually a return to the typical in-school experience.

Over the past two weeks, we have seen many things that have led us to this decision including:

- [rising case numbers in our city and state](#)
- the absolute lack of clear public health metrics that would need to be met and maintained for schools to reopen safely (e.g. fewer than 50 cases for every 100,000 residents)
- [new research](#) showing that children ages ten and older spread the virus at the same rate as adults
- little definitively known of the [long term impacts](#) of the virus
- just as we feel the need to protect children, we also need to keep our staff safe and many have expressed concern over in-person models in this moment
- making this decision now leaves us with time to improve on the model we offered in the spring

I'm sure you have all seen the [plan that the district shared](#) last week at this point and many of you likely followed their Board meeting yesterday. After a long meeting where over a hundred parents, teachers, students, and administrators called for a fully remote model, the School Board of Philadelphia decided to delay their vote on a plan for a week. **We will be in a remote model regardless of their decision.**

A natural next question is when will we go back to some form of in-person instruction. We will look first to the health of our city to determine when we can return to school. Once our city's infection rate has gone down (to a point that will hopefully be defined by public health experts), then we can look internally again at Wissahickon to measure our own ability to implement best safety practices and staffing. Because things are in flux with the district's decision making which is closely tied to what is possible with transportation, we do not know what kind of flexibility we will have around possible in-person start dates. It could be as early as sometime this fall. It could be January or later.

While we feel this is the right course of action for safety, it is not a decision that was made lightly. We know that this will present hardship for families, especially around the question of childcare and your need to get back to work. Unfortunately, this is not a moment where there is one solution that addresses all of the needs of our stakeholders concurrently. In moments such as these, safety comes first.

All Awbury families are invited to come together for a meeting on Wednesday, July 29th from 5:30-6:30 where we will again talk through our rationale for this decision and invite you to share your questions and input. Zoom information is below.

Message from Dean Kristi

Dear Families,

Hope everyone is doing well. As you know, we've been working hard to develop our plan for re-opening for the 2020-21 school year. Two weeks ago I shared that to allow for social distancing in schools, our buildings are not large enough to have all students in-person every day. Because of this we have been working on a hybrid model (some students in person, some remote) that can be scaled up or down quickly to shift as the situation with COVID-19 changes.

This week, the [Philadelphia School District announced their plan for the fall](#). Their plan is a hybrid model that aims to have children in school buildings two

days a week with a remote program for the other three days. We are now in the process of reviewing their plan in depth to see how it can inform our own thinking. There may be questions or approaches that they have considered and tackled that we can now learn from.

Our goal is to be able to share Wissahickon's plan by the end of the month. We will send it out via email first, with family meetings scheduled right afterwards to talk through the plan and answer questions. Once we've shared the plan, it is still possible that it may need to change based on what is happening with the virus itself and local infection rates. Thank you for staying in touch this summer by reading our newsletter each week and taking surveys like the one we sent out last week. We appreciate your partnership in this tough time.

Dear Families,

We are about one month into summer vacation. I hope everyone is getting to safely enjoy some aspects of summer, finding some ways to relax and have fun. We know it can be

tough to hold kids to homework during the summer, but we've created assignments that are hopefully engaging and will set them up to be ready for the next grade. It's essential they complete them - and start now, if they haven't already.

It's also a good time to practice some health-related skills that students will need as we head back to school, in whatever form that takes. We know that wearing a mask will be needed in school and on buses. Please practice this with your child now. Get them a mask they like and have them practice wearing it so they get used to it. One way to get your child invested in proper mask wearing is to give them the job of making sure the whole family is wearing masks responsibly.

Another important skill students need to practice now is hand washing and using hand sanitizer. Please make sure your child knows to wash their whole hands (back and front, between fingers, even the wrists) for 20 seconds with vigorous scrubbing. There are tons of how-to videos online.

Dear Families,

I hope this finds you all safe and well and able to enjoy some aspects of summer. As you know, Wissahickon will follow guidance on reopening schools that is provided by the Centers for Disease Control, Pennsylvania Department of Education and the School District of Philadelphia. At this point, we have some general guidance from the CDC and PDE. We are pursuing & expecting more detailed information, especially from the city, at some point in July. In the meantime, I'm writing to share some of the key principles on which we are basing our fall program.

While it is impossible to eliminate all risk related to the spread of COVID-19, we believe the following guiding principles can help us in minimizing risk for our students, families, and employees.

Physical Safety & Cleaning/Disinfecting

- As long as it is being recommended, we will maintain social distancing of 6ft between individuals at school.
- Classes will be broken into smaller cohorts that will be housed in separate classrooms. Each group will only interact with the students in its own group to limit the number of people students are exposed to.
- With this guidance for spacing, our buildings are not large enough to have everyone in person every day for learning. We will work to provide some combination of in-person and remote learning for all students, with a priority on serving our youngest and most vulnerable students in person the most.
- Students and staff will wear reusable masks. Masks will likely be kept on campus to be laundered.
- Portable hand washing and sanitizer stations will be distributed throughout the buildings. Handwashing schedules will be developed to ensure increased hand hygiene.
- Cleaning and disinfecting practices will be increased and aligned to all recommendations for schools. This will include cleaning spaces between different cohorts' use of them as well as regular wiping down of high-touch surfaces.
- Visitor, as well as drop-off and pick up protocols are being developed.
- Some form of health screening (e.g. symptom reporting, fever scans, etc.) will happen daily for students and staff.

Curriculum & Programming

- Breakfast and Lunch will be in the classrooms. Plans & spaces for specials are being discussed.
- Students will stay in their own classroom throughout the day with the exception of trips outside, to the restroom and to receive special education services.
- A fully remote learning option will exist for all K-8 students whose families are not comfortable with sending their child(ren) to school.
- The social-emotional health of students is a high priority. We will work on ways to actively continue to build community and relationships between students and staff, whether they are working remotely or in person.
- Large events will not be held in person until there is guidance that confirms that it is safe to do so.

We will show flexibility and adapt our model as the conditions and guidance for our area evolve. We will share a model later this summer, once we have seen the School District of Philadelphia's plans. We strive to have plans that align with the different colored phases (e.g. *If the city moves to the "red" phase again, WCS will move to a fully remote model and there will be a plan for exactly how that model looks.*) so all members of our community know what to expect.

Thank you for reading this and for your patience. I know it's hard to not know what things will look like exactly, but I hope this also gives you something to hold on to in the meantime. We will continue to use the Weekly Wissahickon for updates so please be sure to check it each week.

Dear Families,

I want to thank all of you again for your partnership this spring and moving forward. I am especially grateful to families who joined us earlier this week for our Zoom meetings to discuss fall planning. For those of you who couldn't attend, I am attaching our slide show today for your review. I'm also including some of the questions that families raised along with our responses below.

Questions from Family Zoom Meeting:

1. Will any part of school be remote in the fall?

We are working hard on making plans for fall. With the guidance we have right now about social distancing at school, it would be impossible to have all students in the building every day so it is likely that there will need to be some aspect of remote learning. We also know that some families have expressed that their children or family members have health conditions that lead them to want and need a remote option. We will follow all guidance from the state around full closures if they are needed again at any point in the year and in that situation, we would offer a remote program. We are working to make our remote program more robust than the program we offered this past spring. Learning may also take on a hybrid model where students are remote on some days and in person at school some days but details are still being planned.

2. How will bussing work?

This question is on all of our minds as well as the agendas of public officials. The Pennsylvania Department of Education has said it will provide updates on bussing. Our goal would be to ensure that busses have fewer students on them to allow for distancing and ensure students have fair and equitable access to in-person instruction.

3. Will the school still offer an after school program?

The best research we've read says that students should be in small groups and stay in those groups for the whole day. In this way, students will be exposed to fewer people and thus less risk of exposure to COVID-19. We know some parents will need an after school option and will work to offer one that aligns to guidance around safety. Just as the school day will likely look very different, the after school program will too.

4. Will students and staff wear masks? What if a child has asthma?

As long as the CDC is recommending masks, WCS will wear them and provide them. We are looking into providing cloth masks and getting a washer and dryer so that laundry can be done onsite. As the CDC recommends, anyone who has trouble breathing should not wear a mask and will not be required to

wear one at school.

5. Will students with IEPs and 504 plans still get services? What about pull-out programs?

Wissahickon will continue to meet the needs of students in accordance with their IEPs and 504 plans. We will work individually with families to address student needs. We are thinking about pull-out programs given that this could expose students to more peers outside of their small class group. All pull out programs would adhere to all health and safety guidance.

6. Will the school let us know if someone contracts COVID-19? If so, will the school close for 14 days?

We will work with local health officials and follow CDC guidance around what is recommended with regards to notifications and closures. Because students will likely be in small groups that do not interact with other students, we are hopeful that whole school closures due to illness will be rare.

7. If there is a vaccine developed, will students have to get it before they return to school?

Wissahickon would recommend that students receive vaccines when they become available. Decisions to vaccinate for COVID-19 will ultimately be the decision of families.

8. Will there be more technology resources next year?

If possible, we hope to use a portion of our federal funding to purchase Chromebooks for all students in fourth through eighth grades.

9. When will I know who my child's teacher is and have a supply list?

Because it is uncertain how classes will look next year, we are sending home information about the teachers in each grade but not a set classlist and teacher assignment at this point. You will be getting a supply list in the summer mailing that is going out soon. This year we will work for students to not have any shared supplies as a way to minimize the spread of germs.

10. What will lunch and recess be like?

Lunch will happen in the same classroom that students are already in. Lunch will be brought from the cafeteria to the classroom. Recess will still be a part of the day but it is highly unlikely that large groups of students will play and interact in the same space at the same time. Recess will be outdoors as much as possible.

11. Will there be more synchronous learning if school is remote for some or all students?

We are thinking about a variety of ways to make learning more robust for students who are learning remotely, including more synchronous learning. One option may be that while lessons are being taught to students in classrooms at school, they are also live streamed to students at home. Another could be that we have specific instructors assigned to plan and lead remote learning and others designated to teach in the building.

12. Will there be grading?

We are waiting on guidance from the Pennsylvania Department of Education to learn what is recommended.

Next week, the summer mailing will come out with summer work for Reading and Math, the school calendar, supply lists and introductions to classroom teachers. This year we are not placing students into classes until closer to the start of the year as we wait to determine logistics in response to COVID. There will NOT be a new report card since there were no grades in Trimester 3 during Remote Learning (except 7th grade).

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Also, I wanted to pass along that Share will be handing out free food and produce boxes at Pleasant Playground (located at Chew and Pleasant).

I know the flyer is dated Friday June 12th, but the food giveaways will actually be happening every Friday in June at Pleasant Playground. The boxes have a lot of produce and folks can just come and get a box. No questions asked, they just ask that people wear masks.



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
