RAC Families

Welcome back to all of our families who are in the Remote Access Center (RAC) program. We have just finished our first week of the program and want to thank you for all the steps you are taking to keep our whole community safe.

Very important note about RUVNA screenings

If one of your children fails a RUVNA screening, please keep all students in household at home.

Rapid testing

- Turn in your Rapid Test Consent form as soon as possible. You can send it in with your child. Thank you!
- Our nurse will continue to call families to make you aware if we need to administer a test to your child and to share the reason why that is the case. This is a call to make sure you are <u>informed</u>, not to ask for your consent since consent has already happened through the form that has gone home and a Google doc. If we are not able to reach you, we will leave a message and proceed with the Rapid Test. This week, we've found that it has been hard to get in touch with a few families. When there is a potential risk, we need to have information as quickly as possible.
- If you have decided to decline Rapid Testing for your child, please be ready to pick
 up your student, if we have determined that a Rapid Test is needed. You will need
 to provide a negative Covid test, or quarantine for 14 days starting the day of
 pickup from school.

Parent/Guardian Availability During the Day

• As I mentioned above, we had a few instances this week of families who are not available when we called. Safety and health protocols require that we be able to get in touch with you during the school day. Moving forward, if we find that a child needs to go home during the day, we will call all of the numbers a family has provided. If we are not able to reach anyone, then the family will have one hour to get back in touch with us. From the time they call us back, they will have another one hour to pick up the student (unless the end of the school day comes first). If the family does not respond and pick up the child as we've requested, we will not be able to keep your child in the in-person program moving forward. We must have a way to send anyone who is sick home. I would ask that every family make a backup plan for how they would handle the scenario of their child needing to go home midday.

I know we all hold safety and health as the top priority right now. Thank you for your attention to these requests and practices.


On Radar:


Student Art Highlights
