
What does this passage tell us about how Maleeka views herself?

Maleeka uses similes often. On pg #70 she said the bell rang, 'busting up the silence like a fist through the glass.' How did her language make you feel? Was it effective?





"You the one who pushed me to mess up Miss Saunders's room and you were in on it, too- you and the twins," I say, feeling relieved.

If you don't like any of these themes, feel free to write your own and support it.





Maleeka learns that she is much more than just how she looks. Yes, the characteristics of her appearance help to make her who she is, but they are just a piece. She is also what and who she loves, what she likes to do, what she feels. what she believes and how she chooses to act.
